**FOURTEEN GOLF ENTHUSIAST NAMED
2009 LOUISE SUGGS ROLEX ROOKIE OF THE YEAR**

IRVINE, CA – NOVEMBER 16, 2009 – FOURTEEN GOLF, recognized worldwide amongst top touring golf professionals as the foremost leading wedge designer and manufacturer, announced today that an ardent FOURTEEN GOLF fan and user received the prestigious Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year award.

The highly coveted award is given to the first year rookie on the LPGA Tour who scores the highest in a point competition. Mathematically, this extremely focused player has eliminated every other rookie. She has gained 1,407 points this season. The closest player to her in second place is Michelle Wie with 764 points.

If this twenty-one year old continues her stellar play and finishes the season strong, she could join LPGA & World Golf Hall of Fame member Nancy Lopez as only the second player to receive both the Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year and the Rolex Player of the Year.

“We are not surprised this tenacious player won this honorable award. She has an uncanny ability to actually play better in stressful situations. We’re proud to have played a small part in this season’s success,” said FOURTEEN GOLF COO Marcy Kamoda.

The 2009 Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year recipient has been fitted by FOURTEEN GOLF and plays their 52, 56, and 60 degree MT-28 V4 wedges. The MT-28 V4 wedge series provides exceptional spin and ultimate short game performance. For added distance from the fairway, she uses the SF-206 in #3, #5, and #7 woods.

Her support of FOURTEEN GOLF and its equipment make for a powerful partnership. She plays on three professional tours, the LPGA, JLPGA and KLPGA which creates a global awareness for FOURTEEN GOLF.
